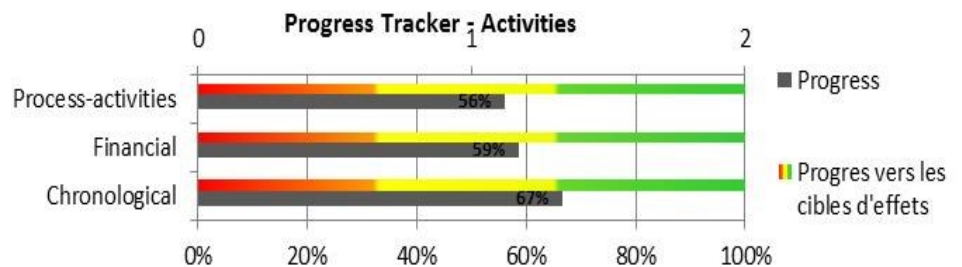

CONTEXT



The project "16/6", has been launched by the Presidency of the Republic of Haiti on September 30th, 2011 in collaboration with the United Nations Development Program (UNDP), the International Labour Office (ILO), the International Organization for Migration (IOM) and the United Nations Office for Project Support Services (UNOPS) to cope with the emergency situation caused by the terrible earthquake of January 12, 2010. In addition to the rehabilitation of the neighborhoods bruised of the Capital and the provision of improved housing supply, this pilot project funded by the Fonds de Reconstruction d'Haïti (FRH) and the Canadian Government seeks to improve the living conditions of the inhabitants of affected areas, promoting the establishment of basic social services and the creation of income-generating activities. An integrated solution that includes the closure of six camps, the relocation and improvement of the quality of life of displaced persons while meeting the urgent needs of physical infrastructure and social problems in selected communities.

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RETURN OF DISPLACED FAMILIES

Initial objectives

- Closure of six camps
- Relocation of 5000 displaced families to their 16 original neighborhoods in Port-au-Prince, Delmas and Petion-Ville

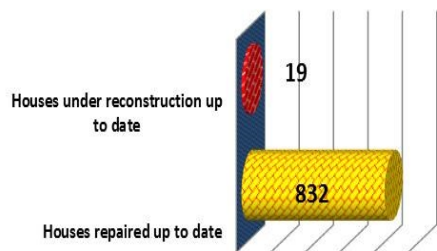
Achievements as of March 31, 2013

- 50 camps have been closed. 24 in targeted neighborhoods, and 26 in Champ de Mars.
- Return of 11 000 families in their original neighborhoods, which is equivalent to 44 000 persons



HOUSING

Housing Reparation and Construction Status



Achievements as of March 31, 2013

- **62 trainers trained and certified**
- **115 workers and foremen trained**
- **832 houses repaired**
- **1304 families** have benefited a better access to housing
- Ongoing construction of 19 houses with newly trained workers in earthquake-resistant construction



REHABILITATION OF NEIGHBORHOODS

Achievements as of March 31, 2013

- **8 community platforms** were created, validated, legalized and trained
- Community planning conducted in 8 districts
- Risk prevention plan developed for the 8 targeted neighborhoods
- **Construction or rehabilitation of 14 water infrastructure**
- **3440 ML reconstructed sidewalks and 300 ML retaining walls made**
- **2686 ML of roads rehabilitated and 2709 ML of drainage canals constructed**
- **More than 500 solar streetlights** being installed
- **More than 10,000 school kits distributed** to students of 45 existing schools in targeted neighborhoods
- Creation and implementation of a logic model of replicable intervention by the government (national or local), agencies and other actors involved in national reconstruction efforts
- **16 scenarios of investment developed and presented to communities** for the installation of electricity transformers, sanitation, development of public spaces etc..



INCOME-GENERATING ACTIVITIES

Achievements as of March 31, 2013

- Launching of the project to strengthen value chains: Program development Suppliers (PDF) in partnership with the Ministry and the Chamber of Commerce and Industry
- Mapping of MSMEs in targeted neighborhoods has been finalized; **1500 businesses registered**
- **2400 jobs created with 75% of women**
- **75% of the workforce recruited from targeted neighborhoods**
- **Strengthening the local economy through the purchase of construction materials in the neighborhoods of 16/6**
- **780 women trained** in personal development, vocational training and business management
- **527 micro-business created and 180 micro-business enhanced** for the women with KOREA funds
